General information:

- Counselors will be assigned to each group and will remain with said group throughout the entire camp season, when possible.
- All cleaning/sanitizing supplies are from approved list of products from the NYS Health Department
- This year, all camp staff is required to be **fully vaccinated!**

Protective Measures/Masking

- Masking
 - o **At this time, campers and staff are not required to wear face coverings.**
 - o Wearing a mask is at the discretion of each camper and their family, and will be honored.
- General wellness checks will be administered for all staff upon arrival at camp.
- General wellness checks will be administered for all campers upon arrival at camp by counselors and Health Director
 - o Any staff or camper showing signs of illness will be immediately sent home.

What happens if a camper or staff is positive for COVID-19?:

- Campers or staff who test positive for COVID-19 must be isolated from other campers/staff and excluded from the camp for at least 5 days.
 - o Isolation ends after 5 full days if the individual is fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication and other symptoms have improved.
- Masking continues to be required upon return from isolation during days 6 through 10.
- Following the identification of a positive COVID-19 case:
 - o Local Health Department will be notified immediately.
 - o Parents of those campers in the same group as the positive case will be notified immediately.
 - o All facilities the individual came in contact with will be sanitized and deep-cleaned.

What happens if a non-vaccinated camper is exposed to COVID-19?

- For campers who are non-vaccinated, we will require mask wearing from the date of exposure and testing at least twice from exposure through day 5.
- Campers must test on day 5.
- Masking will continue to be required from days 6 through 10.

What happens if a vaccinated camper or staff is exposed to COVID-19?

- If asymptomatic, campers or staff may remain at camp.
- Testing on day 5 after exposure is required.

All policies and procedures listed above are subject to change due with new developments and health department regulations concerning COVID-19.
